


Here you see the Ives #1690 that was described in the last issue. This loc as you may remember is owned by Ralph Schisler.

During the summer of 1963 I picked up a very interesting Lionel Standard Gauge set from the original owner. It was in excellent condition, was packed in the original box and was marked "Set #4 Special". This train consisted of a "#10 Special" peacock blue loco, two grey #112 RI gondelas, a #114 orange CM&SP box car, a #113 green cattle car, and a marcon and black #117 NYC&FR caboose. At the time I wondered if the second gondela was an extra or actually same with the set. The locemetive appeared to be like any other peacock blue #10 and why it was labeled "#10 Special" is a mystery to me.

Then in January 1964 I found another "#4 Special" set in even better condition than the first one, and from another securce entirely. When I epened the box, le and behold there was the same car arrangement as before but with a different #10 engine. This second lose was slate grey in color and nickel trimmed instead of brass.


Apparently the " #4 Special" set came with the same cars but with different #10 locomotives. I would appreciate hearing from anyone who has found one of these trains.
