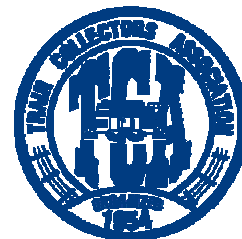

Past president, Bob Caplan, was away at National, where he was participating in the rewriting of the TCA standards guidelines. This is notable as both TCA and TTOS are collaborating on this.

The theme for the February meet was 'favorite things' or 'trains I love', in honor of Valentines Day. Bob Lemberger brought a rare boxed Ives set from 1930.



John Whitmeyer displayed two nice examples of the Lionel pre-war #256 engines. John explained that the 1924 version was the first 'O' gauge engine ever built by Lionel. It was really a narrow gauge standard gauge engine, which ran on 'O' gauge track.

Bob Spellmire proudly held up a nice train and announced, "the theme today is a train you love, but I couldn't care less about this." Actually it was his neighbor's train. The neighbor felt that it might be lonely, and since Bob had so many trains, it was only right that Bob take this one home with him. Bob is considering starting a business introducing lonely trains to each other. He hasn't decided on a name so if you have any suggestions, be sure to let him know. By the way, his neighbor drops in to visit his train on occasion.



Bill Grove had a nice picture of his train and himself taken at a very young age. Unfortunately his father painted the train grey one day as he was into the color of radio equipment of the time. Bill brought a nice #51 engine with thin rims and a #5 tender. The engine is actually a #5 but since it came with the tender it is designated 5+1 or just 51. He also had a Lionel coach from 1910 which is the first coach built by Lionel with the exception of the trolleys.

Bob Trimble had an array of items that included a cute set he had put together from trains he discovered in two different thrift stores. He also displayed a calendar, a double deck bus and a real nice set of Madison cars that appear to be Lionel but were decorated with the Canadian Pacific heralds. He believes they may have been another club's offering and he is trying to track down their origin. William Grove won the raffle prize for the display.

In the kid's raffle, James Zisakis won the train songs video. Michelle Abbe took home the Trains-Planes video. A lively auction was held at the end of the meet, with a wide assortment of rolling stock and motive power going on the block. Items included a Lionel #671 Steam Turbine and tender, several pieces of Marx, and Lionel freight cars, and some American Flyer freight cars.

Coming up are the GATS Show and Fullerton Railroad Days. Walter Olsen suggested we all get involved. He said "interest in the hobby and membership in our club is shrinking."
