This set is valued at \$209. It will be given away at the May 20<sup>th</sup> meet. Thanks to Jon Lang, who organized WD's participation in the Railroad Days event and to Jim Kenney, Bob Lemberger, David Otth, and Mike Donovan for volunteering their time.

**B**ased on the quantity of raffle drawing cards submitted and the volume of information given out regarding Western Division, we can expect visitor attendance to increase greatly for the May meet. #### March & April Meet Recaps

**J**ohn Abbe won the \$100.00 bill at the March meet, where very interesting items were displayed for the theme of 'green' items related to St. Patrick's Day.

Richard Keppel had his large floor train layout in full operation in the back room. As usual, it attracted everyone's interest to see what unique pieces were running on the 'O' and Standard gauge loops and v-8.

At the April meet, the display theme segment was all about 'fools' – buyer's goofs, mistakes, odd-ball items, etc. First up was Bob Caplan who brought in a #110 bell toy carnival type miniature 'ring the bell' item that was made by Lion-Eds, an educational toy made by Lionel PreSchool Toys in the 1930's. He also had a copy of the TCA Quarterly magazine from 2003 that featured the item in an article.



Mario Liberatore presented a pre-war operating stand with box that Lionel built for a locomotive that allowed the engine to be run on the stationary base – part of the 'build a loco' set. William Grove showed us an old rusty engine that he convinced himself was a Dayton Dinky even though he knew it wasn't.

**B**ob Spellmire showed us two American Flyer

Standard gauge Pullman cars that had a mysterious and unusual seam down the middle of each roof. Bob did not notice this anomaly until after he had purchased them and brought them home and took them apart for cleaning. It appeared that someone had welded the roofs from each car together from two half pieces of roofs. This is a big mystery item. When Bob stated that he could not figure out why anyone would do this, or where the other half of each roof was, the crowd responded that the other half from the first car was probably the remaining half of the second car and vice-versa!
